The March Is More Than A Day!

All year we as a committee and you as part of the community must take some responsibility to educate, agitate and plan to bring about our liberation. You will see from the March Aims that they cannot be achieved by just an event one day a year! There are teams of volunteers doing outreach work, on the streets and at events not just in London but all regions in the UK. Likewise fundraising for the March is a national activity and is supported by our increasing regional mobilisation teams and allied blocs.

So the March is a flagship Day of Action for Afrikan Heritage Communities supported by our allies and has dimensions of social movement-building, political protest action and community mobilisation as its characteristics. By doing so, we contribute to the fulfilment of our internal community self-repairs and the external dimensions of reparations by holding the perpetrators to account. None of this is a day's work!

The Reparations March is the street column of the International Social **Movement for Afrikan Reparations (ISMAR)**

The Aims and Objectives of The Afrikan Emancipation Day Reparations March:

- 1. To draw attention to Afrikan People's global determination to not let the British State and other perpetrators get away with the crimes of the Maangamizi (Afrikan Hellacaust of chattel, colonial and neo-colonial enslavement).
- 2. To raise consciousness about the fact that all the attacks on us, in both individual and collective instances, amount to Genocide/Ecocide in Maangamizi continuity necessitating reparations.
- 3. To increase awareness of the necessity to 'Stop the Maangamizi' and its current manifestations such as austerity, attempts to recolonise Afrika, menticide and deaths in police, psychiatric and prison custody.
- 4. To demonstrate Afrikan People's strength, capacity and determination to speak to and challenge establishment power with our growing grassroots power to effect and secure reparations (reparatory justice) on our own terms.
- 5. To showcase Afrikan People's grassroots initiatives for reparations.

March Blocs - Building Mass Reparatory Justice Constituencies

The 9 March Blocs are about engaging different constituencies of Afrikan Heritage Communities all through the year so that come 1st August, they are significantly aware of the mission of the March and the SMWeCGEC and can showcase their own work towards stopping the Maangamizi and effecting Afrikan Heritage Community Self Repairs; which are an essential prerequisite for effecting and securing holistic reparatory justice. What you are doing individually and/or collectively with others that is relevant to reparations is the most important thing to depict and showcase in your placards on the March. The Blocs are themed to broaden the reach and people powerbase of the March in addition to galvanising support for the strategic aims & mission of the SMWeCGEC.
